Topic: Ancient Egypt

This will build on the study of rivers and land usage during their year 3 Earth Matters topic.		Children will use air-dry clay to design, create and evaluate a Canopic Jar that could have been used to hold the organs of a mummy in Ancient Egyptian times.

Objectives	Activities
Geography:	
I can recognise different natural features such as a mountain and river and describe them using a range of key vocabulary.	Children use maps of the world and Africa to locate Egypt on a world and African map.
I can identify and sequence different human environments, such as the local area and contrasting settlements such as a village and a city. I can recognise features and some activities that occur in different settlements using a range of key vocabulary. I can recognise the main land uses within urban areas and the key characteristics of rural areas. I can recognise that there are physical and human differences within countries and continents I can recognise that there are advantages and disadvantages of living in certain environments.	Children will use aerial photographs to look at the physical features of modern Egypt, with focus on the River Nile, and think about how the Ancient Egyptians used this to their advantage. This will build on the study of rivers and land usage during their year 3 Earth Matters topic.
History:	
I can identify details from several themes, societies, events and significant people covered in local, national and global history. I can sequence some events, objects, themes, periods and people from topics covered, by providing a few dates and/or period labels and terms. I can describe some relevant causes for, and effects on, some of the key events and developments covered. I can select what is most significant in a historical account. I can provide a reason why two accounts of the same event might differ. I can ask valid questions for enquiries and answer using a number of sources.
