The children will look at current hand puppet designs available and use this to design their own based upon the theme of a real-life superhero e.g. firefighter, police officer. They will then make by cutting, sewing material together and decorating as planned. Finally, they will evaluate their own and their peers' puppets against the original design criteria.
