### Year 3 Beverley Town Trail

Pupils will compare past and present jobs available in the town of Beverley, comparing what life might have been like in medieval times compared to now.	Pupils will learn about how the local area fits into everything they have learnt about geography so far, discussing which town, county, country and continent they live in. Pupils will take a walk around Beverley, following the 'Town Trail'. They will look at the route on an OS map before the trip, and create a map of the local area (or school) after the trip.	During the trip, pupils will sketch areas of interest. These will then be improved upon, and created in charcoal, back in the classroom.
