Dear Parents/Carers,

We are delighted to be able to welcome all of our children back to school from Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March and are really looking forward to working with them and you as the term progresses.

Most arrangements for the school day will be the same as they were before Christmas. Whilst the lockdown has proved successful in reducing the infection rates, we must ensure that we are still vigilant to help to ensure that these do not begin to rise again when we all return to school.

Arrangements for drop off and pick up for children remain the same as they were in December with staggered start and finish times:

When dropping off and collecting, parents/carers must follow the one-way system and you are asked to ensure that you adhere to social distancing measures. As before please can you wear a face covering whilst in the school grounds( unless you are exempt from doing so). Please can we ask that you arrive at school at your designated time and that just one adult from the family accompanies your child to school. Once you have dropped your child off please ensure that you then leave the school grounds as quickly as possible. School staff will be present at the drop-off point at the start and end of the school day.

















We are asking that if you need to talk to anyone in school that you send your message in an email to beverleystnicholas.primary@eastriding.gov.uk or that you call the school on the number above. If you need to talk in person, please go to the office remembering to maintain social distancing and please wear a face covering (unless you are exempt from doing so).

Within school arrangements still remain the same with the children being grouped into bubbles. Children and staff should not attend school if they have symptoms or are self-isolating due to contact with someone with Covid-19. If your child becomes unwell during the school day we will telephone you and would welcome your cooperation in collecting them as soon as possible. If they are displaying Covid-19 symptoms we would ask that you obtain a test for them as soon as possible. Once you have obtained the test result, please inform the school of the outcome as soon as possible and we will advise you on the next steps. School staff have been taking part in twice weekly lateral flow testing since January and this will continue for the foreseeable future. Should anyone within our school community test positive we will make contact with Public Health England and the Local Authority and follow all necessary steps to ensure that all contacts of the person have been identified and isolated – this may involve having to close bubbles.

From March 8<sup>th</sup> attendance at school once again becomes mandatory unless your child is having to shield for any reason. If they are please can we ask that you share with us a copy of their shielding letter for our records. If your child is absent for any reason please ensure that you contact the school office to let us know.

We should have been holding parent consultations this term but have decided to move these to the summer term once all of the children have been back in school for a month or so. Should you wish to speak to your child's class teacher before those meetings please contact them via the school office.

We are committed to the protection and safety of our pupils and staff and safeguarding is a priority for us. We greatly appreciate all of the support that you continue to give us to enable us to reopen again safely. As always, we appreciate you working with us to ensure that we can provide the absolute best for all of our children. As the academic year progresses we look forward to being able to start to lift some of the restrictions currently in place and begin to be able to operate 'normally' again, whilst following all relevant government guidelines.
