He launched Julia Donaldson and Axel Scheffler to instant fame. His book was voted Britain's favourite bedtime story. But for the sake of readers all over the world, thank goodness he really exists!</p>

The witty classic tale of a cunning but loveable moggy: original, surprising and full of sly humour.
