


Peace at Last-Jill Murphy


Lost and Found-Oliver Jeffers


But when they get there, the boy discovers that maybe home wasn't what the penguin was looking for after all...

Waiting for Wolf- Sandra Diekman



Good Little Wolf- Nadia Shareen



Can a good little wolf still be a real wolf?


And will Rolf discover there's something big and bad lurking inside him after all?
