



Sports Premium Funding 2022/23

At Beverley St Nicholas Primary School, we aim to use the premium funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE teaching and learning at our school, and to build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

We aim to provide:

- High quality teaching in school.
- A varied range of extracurricular opportunities for all children.
- Opportunities for local sports clubs to complement the after school clubs further.
- Ongoing CPD for staff.
- The opportunity to compete in competitions and provide opportunities for competition at a higher level.
- Playground leaders to act as role models to promote/engage pupils with equipment at playtimes and lunchtime.
- All staff with the chance to be involved in teaching PE throughout the year and not just use specialist sports coaches.
- An ethos which promotes us as an active school.
- A life skills approach to teaching and learning in PE

How we promote 30 minutes daily activity:

1. Daily mile / FIT 15
2. 30:30 activity circuit in MUGA
3. Active lessons
4. Active breaks during lessons
5. Playground leaders at lunchtime
6. Promoting active travel to school
7. Engagement with parents to promote activity outside of school

The National Curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety are as follows:

- Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25m.
- Use a range of strokes effectively
- Perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.
